The President-elect and President shall be practicing principals or assistant principals. Should a President-elect or President be unable to fulfill his/her term due to this qualification, the component board from which he/she came shall nominate a replacement to be voted on by the Board. Section 4: 112. The nomination of the component governing body for the President-elect shall be submitted 113. to the Executive Board at least one year prior to the date for assuming the office of president.
